

Did you know??

Arizona tax law offers a tax credit for contributions made to certain charities that provide assistance to the working poor. Arizona Brainfood is one of these charities. For 2017, the maximum amount of this credit is \$800 for married taxpayers and \$400 for individuals.

How the QCO Tax Credit Works*

(Qualifying Charitable Organization Tax Credit program)

Anyone who pays state taxes may be eligible for the QCO Tax Credit, which, unlike a deduction, reduces your state income tax bill dollar-for-dollar. For example: if you owe \$1,000 in state income tax, and you donate \$800, you may subtract the \$800 from your tax bill and pay the state only \$200. You can even use your \$800 donation as a federal income tax donation.

The Arizona QCO Tax Credit can be taken in addition to the Private and Public School Tax credits offered by Arizona!

New for 2017: The Arizona QCO tax credit is available to you even if you don't itemize deductions on your taxes.
